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# **Executive Summary**



In the first semester almost 40% of the time was spent delivering remedial help to referred students from level 4 Foundations classes to help their English in the ILC. The MReader program became more extensive in the second semester after being piloted in the first semester. In the second semester there was a move to expand the Digital Media Course in the Bachelor program, involving Health and Education students.

The iPad labs that had been set up Khalifa and City campuses were discontinued as there was no user demand for them.


# Learning Technologies

Grammarly was introduced to the students – the ILC coordinator visited BAS classes to promote the use of Grammarly. Some BAS students requested lessons for groups on using Google Forms. Mreader was delivered mainly through using iPads, but many teachers took their classes to the ILC labs also.

# **Student Support**

In both semesters the ILC provided assistance to students referred by level 4 Foundation teachers in small classes in the ILC, concentrating on improving reading ting skill. Individual students were helped to use Grammarly, the Clarity suite, plus IELTS students were assisted by the ILC-IELTS website.
